

They lead the nation in the production of important commodities, including spring wheat, durum wheat, canola, flaxseed, honey, oats, sunflower and various pulse crops. 

### ND AG STATS

- The total value of agricultural products sold in 2017 was \$8.2 billion.
- Of the total value of production, 19% originated from livestock and 81% from crops.
- The largest sector in North Dakota's economy, production agriculture makes up almost 25 percent of the state's economic base.
- Nearly one-fourth of North Dakota's workforce are farmers or ranchers or employed in agriculture-related businesses or industries.
- Value-added agricultural processing and farm input manufacturing generates in business activity annually.
- North Dakota's 26,000 farms and ranches occupy 39.3 million acres. The average farm is 1,512 acres.
