DAIRY CATTLE

- All cattle need a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI).
- All cattle must be M-branded and this must be listed on the CVI.
- Proof a whole herd negative TB test on the **birth herd of origin**.
- Proof of **two** negative TB tests by a USDA Accredited Veterinarian, with the last test within 30* days prior to import. TB test charts must be faxed to ND Animal Health Division prior to issuance of a permit number. Refer to [North Dakota Administrative Code §48.1-05-01-02](#).
- All cattle must be individually identified by 484 RFID tags and obtain a permit number prior to entry into ND.
- Females ≥ 12 months must be Official Calhhood Vaccinates for Brucellosis (OCV) and inspecting veterinarian must verify and state on CVI that the shield tattoo is visible.
 - Please note: ND does not recognize adult vaccination.
- Non-virgin and non-pregnant female cattle may not be imported, for breeding purposes, into ND, unless they qualify for the exemptions outlined in [North Dakota Administrative Code §48.1-05-01-02](#).
 - Please contact our office if questions.
- Trichomonas foetus testing required on non-virgin bulls and all bulls ≥ 24 months of age. Refer to [North Dakota Administrative Code §48.1-05-01-02](#).
- Calves < 4 months old, including steers and spayed heifers, not accompanying dam, must include statement on the CVI "These calves are not to be resold within 60 days."

*Exemptions may be made for animals tested within 60 days.
